

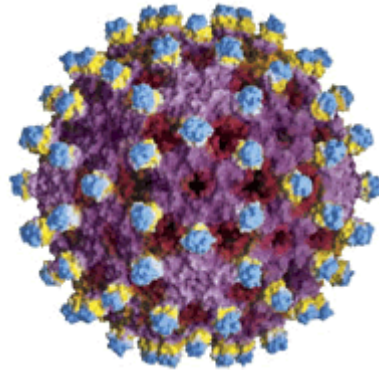

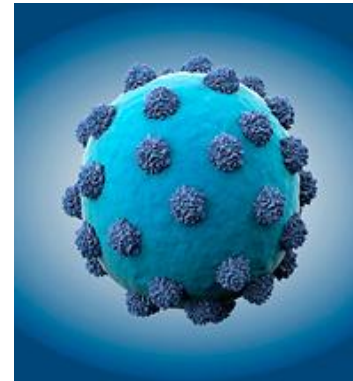
**Around 1 hour or less? 11 Days

Hepatitis B Virus



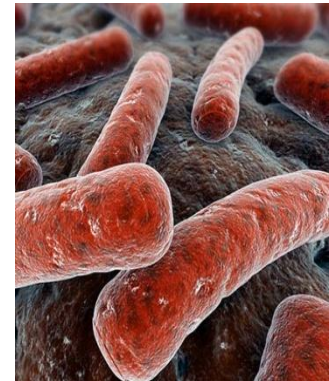
At least 7 days

Hepatitis C Virus



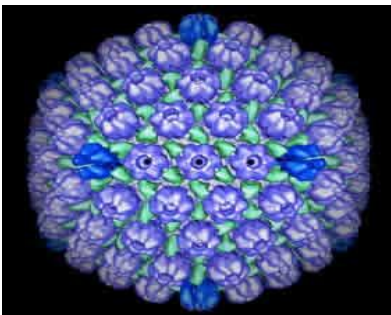
Up to 3 weeks

Mycobacterium tuberculosis



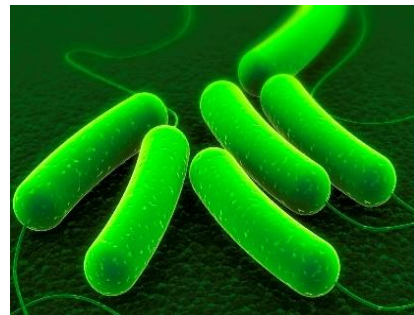

Herpes B Virus/Herpes Virus 1



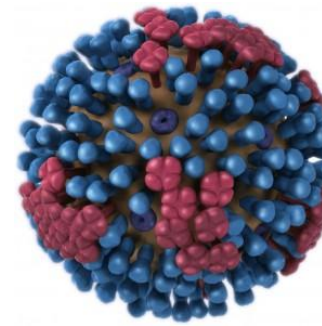
**In culture medium, at 4°C slight

E.coli (General)



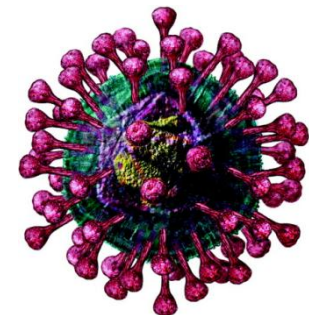
In general 1.5 hours to 16 months.
